### Montana Medicaid Enrollment Dashboard




### Medicaid and CHIP Enrollment February 2023












# New redetermination data dashboard




### Montana Medicaid Redetermination



Montana began the Medicaid redetermination process in April 2023 and has a 60-day redetermination cycle. The data displayed illustrates a point in time, which is updated monthly. Final case status will be available after the 60-day cycle is concluded.

### Renewal Timeline

### First month of renewal process

### **Beginning of month:**

- The Office of Public Assistance tries to renew your coverage with the information they have
- The OPA mails a renewal packet to people who couldn't be automatically renewed

**End of month:** OPA sends a reminder notice about your renewal

### **Second month of renewal process**

This is the month listed under "Check My Benefits" on apply.mt.gov portal

**10th day of month by 5pm:** (if the 10th is a weekend, the following Monday) DPHHS needs to have *received* your renewal packet by the 10th. If nothing is received, a notice that your coverage is ending is sent, and coverage ends at the end of the month

### By the 21st day of month:

OPA mails a letter with the results of your renewal



## It's not too late to return a renewal!

# Q: What happened if folks missed the May 10th deadline?

The OPA automatically sent them a notice telling them that they were going to lose coverage because they didn't complete their renewal.

# Q: Is it too late to complete the renewal?

No. For folks who started the process in April, their Medicaid renewal needs to be received by the OPA by the end of May. If they submit by the end of May and are still eligible, they should stay covered. They probably won't receive a notice saying they are still eligible until sometime in June because it will take DPHHS time to process their case.

# What happens if someone loses coverage and they think they still qualify?

Folks who submitted their renewal and were determined ineligible: If someone thinks that Medicaid has made a mistake and determined them ineligible, they can appeal the determination and request a fair hearing. A fair hearing request must be made in writing. You can find a copy of the notice that someone in this situation would receive. Here is more info about fair hearings from the Medicaid policy manual and from Montana Law Help.

Folks who lost coverage because of procedural reasons - didn't return their renewal packet: If folks lose Medicaid coverage for procedural reasons, meaning they didn't turn in a renewal packet or other info requested by the OPA, but think that they still qualify, they should submit a new application and possibly request retroactive coverage.



# Example

Example: Sam is a single adult who makes \$12,000 a year. Sam lost coverage on June 1st because they didn't return their renewal packet by the end of May. Sam was in the first unwinding group and their renewal process started in April.

- Scenario #1: If Sam reapplies for Medicaid on June 20th, and is found eligible, Sam's coverage effective date is the beginning of the month, June 1st. Sam won't have a gap in coverage.
- Scenario #2: If Sam reapplies for Medicaid on July 20th and requests retroactive coverage, and is found eligible, Sam's coverage effective date is June 1st. If Sam doesn't request retro coverage, their effective date would be July 1st and they would have a gap in coverage.

Note: If Sam accessed any health care services in June before their Medicaid was approved, they may need to ask their health care providers to resubmit claims for those services once their coverage is approved.

### Transitioning from Medicaid to Employer-Sponsored Insurance

Beginning in April 2023, for the first time since early 2020, states can terminate Medicaid for people they have determined are no longer eligible. People enrolled in Medicaid may be required to submit current information about their household and income to stay enrolled in Medicaid.

Normally, the state Medicaid agency requires enrollees to renew their coverage annually. But when the pandemic began in early 2020, Congress enacted laws to help people get through the crisis. One of those laws prohibited states from terminating most people's Medicaid coverage, so states have not been requiring enrollees to go through the annual renewal process and update their eligibility information. This policy ended effective March 31, 2023.

This FAQ focuses on helping people who lose Medicaid transition to employer-sponsored insurance.
