

# Ryan White Part B and the AIDS Drug assistance program

- Federal grant programs funded by HRSA which provide access to comprehensive medical care and support services for low-income people living the HIV/AIDS.
  - HIV and other medications related to co-morbidities with HIV
  - Health Insurance Premiums on the ACA Marketplace
  - Medical case management

### Eligibility

- Montanans who are HIV Positive
- Modified adjusted gross income up to 500% of the Federal Poverty Level

# Blackfeet Tribal Sponsored Health Insurance Program (TSHIP)

### What We Do

The Blackfeet Tribal Sponsorship Health Insurance Program (TSHIP) assists eligible American Indians living within the Blackfeet Contract Health (IHS) Service Delivery Area (Glacier and Pondera Counties) by paying or reimbursing the cost of health insurance premiums paid the member. By sponsoring coverage through the Health Insurance Marketplace (FFM) or reimbursing Medicare Part B and employer-sponsored plans, TSHIP ensures Tribal members have access to affordable care and stay insured year-round.

### Who We Serve

- Enrolled members of federally recognized Tribes who are eligible for Marketplace or Medicare coverage.
- Enrolled members of federally recognized Tribes who are currently enrolled in their employers health insurance group plan, or carried their employers health coverage into retirement.

### Impact on Access & Affordability

- Coverage at no cost to participants
- Reduces gaps in coverage and out-of-pocket expenses
- Generates revenue for Tribal Health Entities and IHS facilities, improving care quality
- Helps lower Montana's uninsured rate by sponsoring Tribal members into coverage

### Why It Matters

TSHIP strengthens Tribal sovereignty, supports community health, and ensures that no one goes without coverage because of cost.

- 20 Title X clinics throughout the state.
- All offer a variety of sexual and reproductive health services.
- Patients under 250% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL) qualify for a discount.
- Only eligibility requirement for discount is patient needs to be of reproductive age.
- Title X funds should be the payer of last resort and most clinics can bill public and private insurance.
- Funding is secure through the end of March 2026.

# Medication Affordability – Options?

- 340B Drug Pricing Program
  - Federal program through manufacturers.
  - Discounted medication pricing for eligible patients.
    - Eligible prescription at an eligible pharmacy.
    - Below 200% FPL.



- Patient Assistance Program (PAP)
  - Programs offered directly through the manufacturer.
    - Coupons, copay cards, free trial, or rebates
    - Shipped directly from manufacturer for small fee or free
    - www.needymeds.org
  - Charitable Organization
    - Such as Direct Relief and Americares



The MCSP assists with breast and cervical cancer screening tests and exams, as well as most diagnostic tests to rule out breast or/and cervical cancers.

- Statewide program with 14 sites to assist local communities
- Income eligibility 250% of Federal Poverty Level
- Uninsured AND under-insured (deductible/copay \$200 or more)
- Multiple procedures can be covered up until the diagnosis

- Referral process to the MT Breast and Cervical Cancer Treatment Program (MBCCTP) if diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer through program assistance
